DETAMS At approximately 8:30AM, this date, myself, Officer Colwell, Hewitt Fire Marshal Jimmy Clark met Waco P.D. Detective James Blair at the Donaldson Sand and Gravel Co., on South University Parks Drive. BLAIR is a State-Certified Arson Investigator on loan to us courtesy of Lt. Harold Steig, Waco C.I.D. Chief. Blair reviewed the photographs of the fire scene we had, read most of the case report and was orally briefed on the case by us and Jimmy Clark. Also present, part of the time, were Donnell Donaldson, owner of the site, and Bi 1 Donaldson, part-owner, and Constable, Pct. 1, McLennan County. Myself, Colwell, Clark, and Blair systematically went through the fire debris that was dumped at the location. On three occasions, D. Donaldson used a front-end Loader/tractor to move the debris around for us so we could have access to most of the remains of the shed. Donaldson told us he had received phone calls from both the District Attorney's Office and KWTX-TX inquiring about the fire debris. A female reporter and male camera operator in a vehicle marked "KWTX-TV, Channel 10" arrived at approximately 10:00AM, shot some video and watched us for about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hours. The reporter asked what we were looking for and we replied we were just going through the debris one more time to complete our report. She also asked when the "State Fire Marshall" was due to arrive, if we knew anything about insurance policies on the boys and if the shed door had been locked, to which we replied "we had no comment" and referred her to the Chief's Office for any statement. We spent approximately three(3) hours at the site going through the debris. At the conclusion of the effort, Detective Blair stated that, based on his expert opinion, he would not attempt to retrieve any or all of the debris and/ or retain any of it for the following reasons: First, it was now "contaminated" due to its being mixed with other trash and foreign objects, the rain and dirt. Secondly, no "chain" of protected custody of any or all the debris existed.
