Acquitted DA accepts 2-year bar probation

AUSTIN (UPI) — McLennan County District Attorney Vic Feazell, acquitted last year of racketeering and bribery charges, has been placed on two years' probation by the State Bar of Texas, a bar official said Tuesday.

A bar spokesman said Feazell agreed to accept probation to settle two grievances filed against him by a local bar committee in Waco.

One stemmed from charges that Feazell accepted bribes from his former law partners in exchange for lenient treatment of their clients. The other alleged Feazell called Waco District Judge George Allen a liar.

In an attachment to the suspension, Feazell wrote that he did not act unprofessionally, but agreed to the penalty to settle complaints against him to avoid lengthy and expensive lawsuits.
