Graf trial to resume Thursday

Prosecution testimony in the capital murder trial of Edward E. Graf Jr. will continue at 9 a.m. Thursday after a fiveday break.

Testimony will be postponed until Thursday because one of the jurors, the executive vice president and general manager of Brazos Electric Power Cooperative Inc., is committed to attending a national convention.

The juror is president of the National Association of Generation and Transmission Managers, which is meeting in The state expects to rest its case after three expert witnesses testify, says McLennan County District Attorney Vic Feazell.

Judge George Allen of Waco's 54th State District Court said attorneys on both sides were aware he would be going to the convention when they selected him as a juror. The judge said since both sides wanted him so badly as a juror and the juror already has invested five days of his time in the trial, he thought it best to postpone the trial.

The state probably will rest its case against Graf after the testimony Thursday of three expert witnesses, said McLennan County District Attorney Vic Feazell.

Graf, 36, is charged with two counts of capital murder in the August 1986 fire deaths of his two stepsons, Joby, 9; and Jason, 8.
